'It is finished' (John 19.28)

These are the words of Jesus on the Cross before he gives up his spirit and dies. The Greek word used for finished can also be translated as completed or accomplished.

There will be few of us who when we come to the end of our lives will be able to say that we have accomplished or completed all that we wanted.

My last Sunday with you as your Vicar will be the 17th of August. Sue and I will fly back to the UK the following day and resume where we left off last December. This will conclude my time in an official role at Christ Church Bangkok. It also marks the end of my third stint as Interim Vicar – which has covered over a period of about three and a half years.

Inevitably, I will be looking back at my time with you and wondering what has been completed or achieved. There is much to celebrate as achievements – I will not list them as it's up to others to see the progress made in the various aspects of the church.

It's also true to say that there is much that has not been completed or accomplished. By nature, I am a 'starter and a finisher'. I like to have goals and achieve them or go some way to achieve them.
